



Pupil Premium – Reporting to Parents

Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all the pupils
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil Premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of Pupil Premium interventions at one time.

Provision The range of provision the Governors may consider include:-

- 1-1 Tuition
- Additional teaching & learning opportunities provided through trained TAs or external agencies
- All our work through the Pupil Premium will be aimed at accelerating progress, moving children to at least age related expectations. Initially this will be in Literacy & Numeracy.
- Pupil Premium resources may also be used to target able children on FSM to achieve Level 3 at the end of KS1 or Level 5 at the end of KS2.
- The Governors of the school will publish information on how they have used their Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) to address the issue of 'narrowing the gap', for socially disadvantaged pupils.

Pupil Premium Grant Allocation for 2011/2012 was £7920 and targeted for:-

- 1-1 Tuition for 5 pupils
- Increase TA hours for 4 months to deliver intervention programmes
- Purchase of literacy materials. Low level, high interest books
- Purchase of phonics materials
- Purchase of maths equipment

- Headteacher cover for Service children sharing days
- Supply cover for Phonics training
- Visit to Le Cateau

The impact of the PPG for 2011/12 was:-

- Improved attainment for the 5 pupils
- Improved rates of progress in phonics and Sentence Level work.
- Increased understanding of Service families issues
- Increased progress for 4 out of 6 FSM children

Pupil Premium Grant Allocation for 2012/2013 is £10,000 and will be targeted at:-

- 1-1 Tuition for 8 pupils
- Supply cover for maths training
- Increase TA hours for 1 year to deliver intervention programmes
- Purchase YARC (York Assessment of Reading and Comprehension)
- HLTA Training and delivery of YARC.
- TA supply for YARC training
- TA supply for phonics training
- TA supply for maths intervention training
- Headteacher cover for Service Children Sharing Days
- TA extra hours for attending Service Family Day
- Cost of joint small cluster KS2 event with Alanbrooke Barracks

The impact of the PPG for 2012/13 was:-

- YARC is finely pinpointing areas of need for children who require intervention.

- Service Family Day provided KS2 Service children with a varied activity day which has resulted in responses, reflections and challenges from children. Please see Pupils' Response sheet.
- Impact from intervention work for the 2012/13 Year 6 pupils receiving Pupil Premium. 100% made expected progress and more. Progress from Year 2 to Year 6 showed 50% of pupils making better than expected progress in Maths, Writing, and Science with 100% making better than expected progress in Reading. Pupil Premium children outperformed all non-Pupil Premium children and National overall.

Pupil Premium Grant Allocation for 2013/2014 is £12,000 and will be targeted at:-

- Autumn Term 1 teaching morning p/week to work with children on Maths for 10 weeks
- Small teaching group for Maths 10 x 1hr
- Small teaching group for Reading 10 x 1hr
- Purchase of Numicon
- Purchase of Sandwell ENT KS2 complete set (1st Class Maths)
- Spring Term 2 teaching days p/week to work with children on Maths for 12 weeks

The impact of the PPG for 2013/14 was:-

Pupil Premium Grant Allocation for 2014/15 is £24,000 and will be targeted at:-
